# **Bag PORTO CESAREO**

Yarn RAFIA





#### Intermediate

Finished measurements:  $48 \times 30 \text{ cm} (18 \% \times 11^{13}/_{16})$  (fringes not included).

**Materials:** Adriafil Rafia brown (78): 2 skeins; Adriafil Rafia burnt umber (52): 2 skeins; Adriafil Rafia honey (58): 2 skeins; Adriafil Rafia ivory (53): 2 skeins; Adriafil Rafia cream (55): 2 skeins; size 4.50 mm (7US-7UK) crochet hook; brown zip,  $45 \text{ cm} (17^{11}/_{16})$  long; brown sewing thread; plastic slat, 48 cm (18 %) long, 5,5 cm (2 %) wide.

#### Patterns and stitches:

Chain, double crochet, half treble, treble.

**Front post treble (FPtr):** treble inserting hook underneath the post of next st, from front to back.

**Back post treble (BPtr):** treble inserting hook underneath the post of next st, from back to front.

## Ribbed stripe:

**Row 1:** ch3 (counts as 1st tr throughout), tr1 in each st. **Row 2:** ch3, \*1 FPtr, 1 BPtr, repeat from \* to last st, 1 FPtr.

Rows 3 and 4: ch3, \*1 FPtr, 1 BPtr, repeat from \* to last st, 1 FPtr.

**Tension:** 13 htrs and 10 rows using size 4.50 mm crochet hook =  $10 \times 10$  cm  $(4 \times 4^{\circ})$ .

Take time to check tension and change hook if necessary.

#### **Directions:**

**Note:** pattern is worked in one piece in back and forth rows, beginning from upper edge.

**Note:** when you change colour cut yarn in use, then tie a knot with old and new yarns.

Using brown chain 68.

Rows 1-8: ch1 (counts as 1st dc throughout), dc1 in each st.

Rows 9-13: work ribbed stripe.

Change to htr alternating colours as follows:

**Row 14:** using burnt umber ch2 (counts as 1st htr throughout), htr in each st.

**Row 15:** using burnt umber 9 htrs, using honey 59 htrs.

**Row 16:** using honey 30 htrs, using ivory 30 htrs, using honey 8 htrs.

Row 17: using ivory 21 htrs, using cream 47 htrs.

Row 18: using cream 68 htrs.

Row 19: using ivory 68 htrs.

Row 20: using ivory 14 htrs, using honey 54 htrs.

Row 21: using honey 68 htrs.

Row 22: using burnt umber 68 htrs.

Row 23: using burnt umber 30 htrs, using brown 38 htrs.

Row 24: using brown 68 htrs.

Row 25: using burnt umber 68 htrs.

Row 26: using burnt umber 20 htrs, using honey 48 htrs.

**Row 27:** using honey 68 htrs.

Row 28: using ivory 68 htrs.

Row 29: using ivory 34 htrs, using cream 34 htrs.

Row 30: using cream 68 htrs.

Row 31: using ivory 68 htrs.

Row 32: using ivory 26 htrs, using burnt umber 42 htrs.

Rows 33 and 34: using burnt umber 68 htrs.

Row 35: using burnt umber 24 htrs, using brown 44 htrs.

Row 36: using brown 68 htrs.

Row 37: using burnt umber 68 htrs.

Row 38: using burnt umber 40 htrs, using honey 28 htrs.

**Row 39:** using honey 68 htrs.

**Row 40:** using ivory 68 htrs.

Row 41: using ivory 40 htrs, using cream 28 htrs.

Row 42: using cream 68 htrs.

Row 43: using ivory 68 htrs.

Row 44: using ivory 22 htrs, using honey 46 htrs.

Row 46: using burnt umber 68 htrs.

Row 47: using burnt umber 22 htrs, using brown 46 htrs.

Row 48: using honey 68 htrs.

**Row 49:** using burnt umber 68 htrs.

**Row 50:** using burnt umber 18 htrs, using honey 50 htrs.

Row 51: using honey 68 htrs.

**Row 52:** using ivory 68 htrs.

Row 53: using ivory 18 htrs, using cream 50 htrs.

Row 54: using cream 68 htrs.

**Row 55:** using ivory 68 htrs.

Row 56: using ivory 34 htrs, using honey 34 htrs.

Row 57: using honey 68 htrs.

Row 58: using burnt umber 68 htrs.

Row 59: using burnt umber 52 htrs, using brown 16 htrs.

Rows 60-64: using brown work ribbed stripe.

**Rows 65-73:** using brown ch1 (counts as 1st dc throughout), dc1 in each st.

Fasten off.

### Finishing:

Fold first and last 8 dc rows to WS and sew. Make a more stable upper edge inserting plastic slat in one casing. Sew one zip band to each long edge.

Fold piece in half and close side seams by attaching fringes. Place 27 fringes along each side.

For each fringe, cut 1 strand of yarn,  $14 \text{ cm} (5 \frac{1}{2})$  long, fold in half, place loop over crochet hook and draw through both edges from back to front. Bring yarn ends through loop and tighten.
